- This provides our physicians the opportunity to spend more time caring for their patients in their communities.

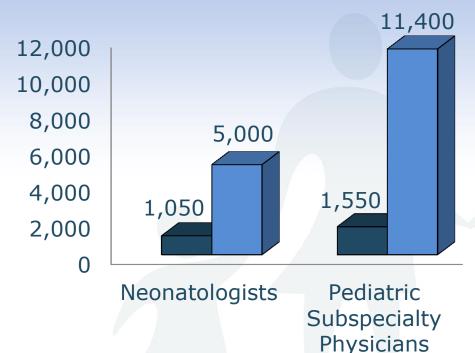

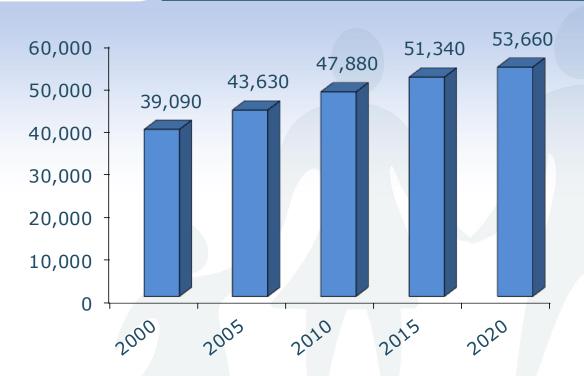

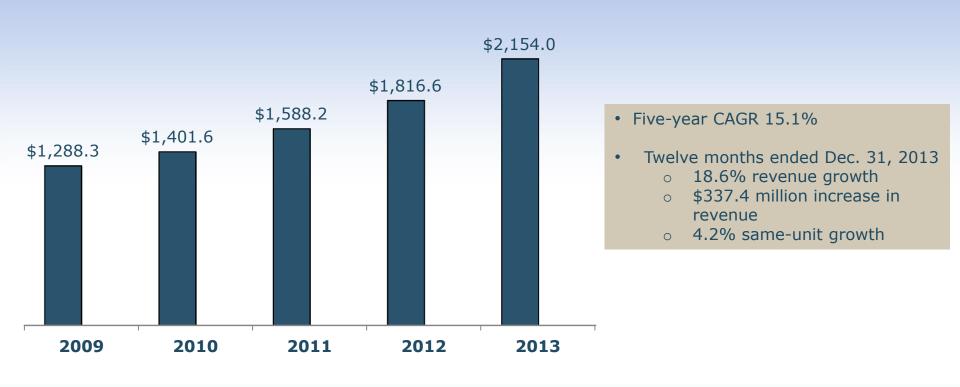

Revenue (\$ millions)



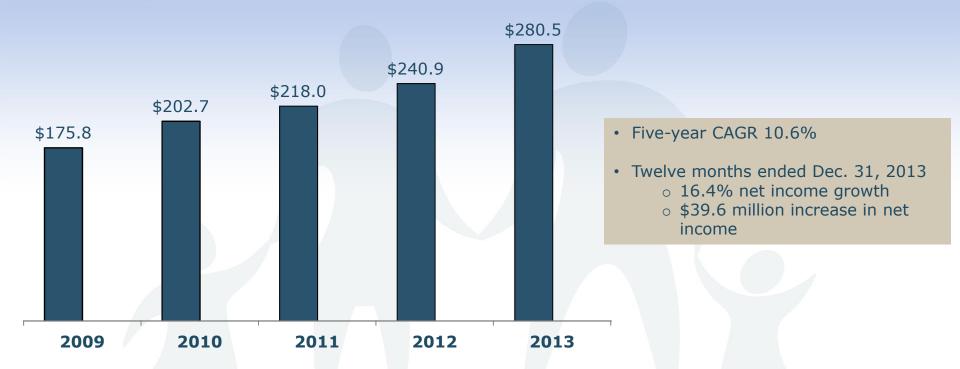


Operating Income (\$ millions)
